Macaroni Loaf

½ cup elbow macaroni, 1 cup scalded milk, 1 cup soft bread crumbs, 1 table-spoon butter, 1 tablespoon chopped onion, 1 tablespoon chopped green pepper. 1 table-spoon minced parsley, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon salt, ½ cup American cheese, grated, butter. spoon salt, butter.

Cook macaroni until tender and rinse in cold water. Saute onion, pepper and parsley in butter until soft. Beat yolks and whites of eggs separately. Mix vegetables, egg yolks and salt with macaroni. Stir in whites of eggs. Put a layer of macaroni in well oiled or buttered baking dish; cover with a layer of vegetables, add a layer of cheese mixed with bread crumbs, and alternate lavers, with cheese and bread crumbs on top. Pour milk over and dot with butter, bake at 350 degrees F. for 40

Tuna Pie

1½ cups diced potatoes, ½ cup diced celery, 1 tablespoon chopped onion, ½ cup canned peas, 1 pimiento cut in strips, 1 7-ounce can (1 cup) flaked tuna, ¾ teaspoon salt, ½ (easpoon pepper, ½ cup vegetable liquor, 1 tablespoon flour, 1 recipe cheese swirls.

Cook potatoes, celery, and onion in small amount of salted water until tender. Drain. Combine vegetables and tuna. Pour into greased 1-quart casserole. Add seasonings. Gradually add vegetable liquor to flour; blend, Pour

over tuna and vegetables. Arrange cheese swirls on top. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 degrees) 20 minutes. Serves 4 to 5.

Sift 1 cup flour with 1/4 teaspoon salt and 2 teaspoons baking powder; cut in 11/2 to 2 tablespoons shortening. Add 1/3 cup milk; mix just until flour is moistened. Turn onto lightly floured surface; knead 1/2 minute. Roll 1/4 inch thick. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup grated American cheese. Roll as jelly roll. Cut 1/2-inch slices. Makes 8 or 9 biscuits.

Crusty Cheese Loaf

Cut crusts from top and sides of un-sliced loaf. Slice to, but not through, bot-tom crust. Blend ½ cup butter or forti-fied margarine with ¾ pound sharp, spreading cheese. Spread slices, top and sides. The with string. Bake in hot oven (400 degrees) 20 minutes, until cheese is melty and bread crusty.
