Negro Insurance Firms Lead In Building Homes in Chicago

themselves to improving an area were the Supreme Liberty Life Insurance company, the Metropolitan Mutual Assurance company and the Jackson Mutual Life Insurance company. Their plans are to start building by spring. Two other colored insurance companies, the Victory Mutual Life Insurance company and the Unity Mutual Life Insurance company, also may enter the program.

Truman K. Gibson, Sr., wartime aide to the secretary of war, president of Supreme Liberty and leading spokesman for the plan, said that the program will begin with a 50 homes project in a two square block area. "This will be only a start of a six block development," he added.

The Chicago land clearance commission, in charge of buying slum land for rebuilding by private firms, has already approved the insurance companies' plans.

Mayor Martin H. Kennelly took the first action last week by introducing a resolution to the City Council authorizing the land clearance commission to purchase the area to be rebuilt.

In supporting this slum clearance program financially, the colored firms added their names to that of the New York Life Insurance company to redevelop an area once considered one of Chicago's best residential districts.
