Lincoln Council Holds One Week Training School

The leadership training school of the Lincoln Council of Religious Education will be held Jan. 30 to Feb. 4. A school will be held on Sunday 2:30 to 4:30 p. m. and Monday and Tuesday 7:30 to 9:15 p. m., at First Evangelical United Brethren church, 33rd and Starr. Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, the same faculty teaching the same courses will move to First Presbyterian church, 17th and F. Courses are accredited by the International Council of Religious Education.

Dr. G. S. Willey will give a course on Sunday school administration for Sunday school superintendents and members of education committees in the local churches. Dr. C. Vin White will teach a course on the life and work of St. Paul. Mrs. R. R. Kreps, Miss Hildegard Persson and Mrs. Henry Engel will give courses on methods for teaching intermediates, juniors and primary children respectively.
