## NCASP Group to Establish \$25,000 Defense Fund

NEW YORK. (ANP). The National Council of the Arts, Sciences and Professions completed plans to establish a \$25,000 defense fund to provide legal aid to educators "who are victims of academic tyranny in this country."

The fund is to provide immediate assistance to professors, librarians and other persons whose "academic freedom has been abridged" through recent denials of political and civil liberties on the nation's campuses. The announcement also stated that the Bureau of Academic Freedom and the Educators division of the NCASP, will cooperate with the Law division in implementing the program.
