HOUSEHOLD HINTS

After the Meeting

When friends meet at your house, don't be too concerned about refreshments. Something easy to fix often goes over better than a fancy dessert or salad you've worried about for hours. Spiced tea or coffee and cookies are a good example of easy-to-do lunch. Bake the cookies the day before so you'll be free the morning of the event to straighten up the house and yourself. You can have ingredients measured for the beverage before guests arrive. Make an assortment of cookies so that you will have enough to keep the plates filled.

Spiced Tea

3 lemons
 4 oranges
 2 tablespoons orange pekoe tea
 2 cups sugar
 1/2 teaspoon allspice
 1/4 teaspoon cloves
 1/4 gallon boiling water
 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
 Squeeze juice from lemons and oranges. Cut rinds of 2 oranges and 1 1/2 lemons into pieces and place in cloth bag with tea, cinnamon, allspice, cloves and nutmeg. Place in water and simmer for 10 minutes. (Do not boil.) Remove from heat and remove tea bag. Bring sugar and fruit

juices to a boil and stir into tea. Serve piping hot. Serves 25.

Coffee for 20

1/2 lb. coffee (about 2 1/2 cups)
 1 gallon boiling water
 Muslin bag

The bag should be large enough to hold twice the amount of coffee called for. Put coffee in the bag, tie with a string and drop in the boiling water. Cover tightly and let stand over low heat from 7 to 10 minutes. Swish coffee bag around several times and remove. Serve immediately. Makes 20 cups.

Oatmeal Tea Cookies

1/2 cup flour
 1/4 teaspoon soda
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
 6 tablespoon shortening
 1/2 cup brown sugar
 1 beaten egg
 1 3/4 cups rolled oats
 1/4 cup milk
 1/4 cup chopped nuts
 1/4 cup chopped raisins

Sift together flour, soda, salt and nutmeg. Cream shortening and brown sugar thoroughly and add beaten egg. Stir in rolled oats, add milk, then flour mixture, nuts and raisins, stirring until well blended. Drop by tablespoonfuls into greased muffin cups or onto a lightly greased cookie sheet. Bake in a moderate oven (350°) for 25 minutes. Makes 18 cookies.
