Fruit Salad

- 1 can whole apricots
- 1 can pear halves
- 1 small jar maraschino cherries
- 1 can peach halves
- 1 can grapefruit sections
- Lemon juice
- Red cabbage leaves
- Parsley

Arrange drained fruit attractively on perfect red cabbage leaves. Sprinkle with little lemon juice. Garnish with parsley. Serve with fruity mayonnaise dressing in separate bowl.

Fruity Mayonnaise Dressing.

- 1/2 cup cranberry-orange marmalade
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- Dash cayenne

Blend ingredients thoroughly. Cranberry-orange marmalade, a new purchasable spread, makes a delightful combination of flavors with mayonnaise—colorful, too.

Peanut Butter Marmalade Sandwiches

- White bread, thinly sliced
- Butter or vitamized margarine, softened
- Parsley
- 1 part peanut butter, cream or chunk style
- 1 part orange marmalade
- Ripe olives

Spread bread slices with butter or margarine. Blend peanut butter and marmalade thoroughly.

Spread one slice of each sandwich with marmalade mixture. Top with buttered slice. Cut off bread crusts. Cut each sandwich in 1-inch lengths. Arrange on plate with cream cheese nut sandwiches. Garnish with ripe olives and parsley.

Cream Cheese Nut Sandwiches

- Whole wheat bread, thinly sliced
- Butter or vitamized margarine softened
- 1 cake cream cheese
- 1/2 cup finely chopped nuts
- Dash cayenne
- 1/2 cup finely chopped ripe olives
- 1 teaspoon grated onion
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- Cream

With a sharp 2-inch cookie cutter, cut rounds from slices of bread. Spread slices with butter or margarine. Blend remaining ingredients thoroughly. Spread mixture on one slice of each sandwich. Top with buttered slice.
