Frosted Grapes

Wash and break in clusters 1 lb. white grapes Beat slightly 1 egg white 1 tablespoon water Measure 1/2 cup sugar Put sugar on waxed paper. Dip grapes in egg white, then in sugar. Chill in refrigerator about 1 hr.

Peppermint Stick Chiffon Pie

Soak 1 envelope gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water Scald 1/2 cup milk Stir in 1/2 cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 cup crushed peppermint stick candy Beat slightly 4 egg yolks Add egg yolks to milk mixture. Cook over boiling water until custard coats a spoon. Stir in gelatin. Chill until thick and syrupy. Beat 4 egg whites Fold into custard. Pour into chocolate cookie crumb crust. Chill until firm, about 3 hours. Serve with whipped cream. Makes 9-inch pie.

Black Cherry Chiffon Pie

Drain and chop 2 cups pitted black cherries 1 envelope gelatin in 1/4 cup cherry juice Beat together 4 egg yolks 1/2 cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup cherry juice 1 teaspoon lemon juice Cook over boiling water until thick. Stir in gelatin and cherries.

Chill until thick and syrupy. Beat 4 egg whites Fold into cherry mixture. Pour into corn flake crust. Chill until firm, about 3 hours. Serve with toasted almonds. Makes 9-inch pie.

Orange Frosting.

Use your electric mixer to do a quick job of beating this frosting. 1 1/2 cups sugar 6 tablespoons orange juice 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar 2 egg whites 2 teaspoons grated orange rind Mix all ingredients in the top of a double boiler. Beat over hot water with a rotary beater until the icing will hold up in peaks. Spread between cooled layers, on top and sides of orange cake.

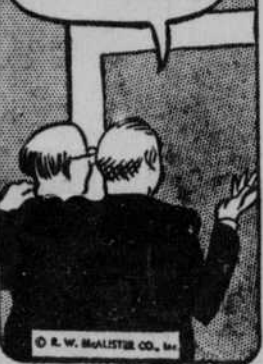
