
2 tablespoons milk

Cut eggplant lengthwise, and scoop out pulp from the center. Saute the onions in butter, add the pulp of the eggplant, parsley, and then the meat. Season with salt and pepper and mix well. Simmer about 10 minutes. Stuff the eggplant shells with the mixture, cover and bake in a moderate oven (350°) for 30-35 minutes. Mix egg, cheese and milk, and season with a dash of salt
