Low Cost Main Dish

- 1 medium onion
- 2 tbsp. drippings
- 1 cup cooked tomatoes
- ½ lb. hamburger or ground ham seasoning
- 1 cup cooked macaroni or noodles

Fry the onions (minced) in the drippings. Add other ingredients and bake about 40 minutes in a slow oven. Serve with a salad and small dessert. This recipe good for using leftover meats.

Fried Chitterlings

Prepare chitterlings and boil. When tender, drain well. Cut in 2-inch squares. Dip in a good batter and fry in deep fat. Drain. Serve hot with assorted salad plate and pickles.

- 1 cup applesauce (other fruit may be used instead)
- 1 teaspoon soda
