The census for many years has been an important function of government. In Nebraska it was turns. the first official act of the newlycreated territorial government, and preceded formal organization of the territory. Indeed, it provided the basis for that organiza-

Almost immediately upon assuming office, Acting Governor Thomas B. Cuming (Governor Burt, you will remember, died shortly after his arrival in Nebraska) issued a proclamation di-October 24 and November 20, 1854. He divided the eastern or settled portion of the territory into six districts, assigning a deputy to

Governor Cuming's instructions to the marshals were explicit. They were to be particularly careful that no names were enrolled except those of actual residents, and if the marshal had any doubt about the residence\_of a person he was to require the individual in question to subscribe to a written oath relative to his place of abode.

Governor Cuming also instructed the marshals as follows: 'The column of 'remarks' is designed to present facts, as to the condition of the inhabitants and character of the country in your district; and you may also embody therein, or in a separate memorandum, such facts as you can obtain without hindrance, as to the

On the basis of this first census, Governor Cuming divided the set- languages. tled portion of the territory into eight counties (Richardson, Pierce, Forney, Cass, Douglas, Dodge, Washington and Burt), set up an apportionment, and provided for an election of members to the territorial legislature and of a delegate to congress.

There was much dissatisfaction with Governor Cuming's apportionment, particularly in the South Platte region where the Governor's opponents claimed that it was rigged in favor of the North Platte section.

Unfortunately, the marshals failed to carry out that part of the Governor's instructions relative to collecting data regarding the "condition of the inhabitants and the character of the country." The column "remarks" is almost universally blank.
