SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON Amos the Prophet and His Program Scripture - Amos 7:7-15;

Memory Selection-Seek the Lord and ye shall live. Amos 5:6.

Our ministers today, the modern "Prophets," have definite programs outlined for them if their work is to succeed. They must plan the activities of their churches, work out sermons related to the special observances of our church year-such as Palm Sunday, Easter, etc., They must plan their church school work, institutes for their workers, a routine of pastoral visitation, must earry communion to the sick. They must visit and comfort the dying, and bury the dead. They must plan means of raising finances-to administer to the needy, to care for themselves and for the maintenance of their institution, and for the denominational work-its overhead and its benevolences.
