Scalloped Liver and Potatoes

| otatoes | 1 green pepper |
|---------------|------------------|
| b. liver | 1¼ teaspoon salt |
| onion, minced | 1½ cups milk |

Boil the potatoes in their jackets; when done, peel and cut in slices. Drop the liver in boiling salted water and cook from 5 to 10 minutes. Cut into small pieces. Grease a baking dish. Cover the bottom with a layer of potatoes, add a layer of liver, and sprinkle with onions, green peppers, and seasoning. Repeat until the ingredients are used. Add milk and bake for 30 minutes in a moderate oven (350° F.).

Seven-Minute Frosting

2 egg whites

1% cups sugar

5 tablespoons cold water 1½ teaspoons light corn sirup

1 teaspoon vanilla

Put the egg whites (unbeaten), sugar, water, and corn syrup in the upper part of the double boiler. Place it over rapidly boiling water, beat constantly with a rotary egg beater, and cook 7 minutes or until the frosting will stand in peaks. Remove from the fire, add vanilla, and beat until
