Negro Collegians To Make Good Will World Air Tour

RICHMOND, Va. (ANP). A group of 50 Negro college students will step off on a round-the-world air tour to spread pro-democracy messages to the people of at least 25 nations beginning June 25, it was announced here last week. The tour, sponsored by the Virginia Union university, is an outgrowth of an idea conceived by Clennon King, faculty member who acted as adviser to the school's four-man foreign study team which traveled abroad last

King is faculty director of this year's travel group, which bears the name of "Round-the-World Study Project." The primary objectives are to crusade against communism and to affirm their faith in democracy. The students, who will be official guests in every land they visit, will spread their messages both to officials and the common people.

Participants will be selected from applications received from all parts of the country. Any Negro student in any college is eligible to apply. Accepted applicants will be given from nine to 12 semester hours credit by Virginia Union.
