Walnut Marble Spice Cake.

- 3 cups sifted cake flour
- 3 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup butter or other shortening
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup milk
- 1 1/2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon cloves
- 3/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 3 teabspoons molasses
- 1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts

Sift flour once, measure add baking powder, salt; sift together 3 times. Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time, beat well. Add flour alternately with milk at little at a time, beating till smooth each time.

Divide batter into two parts, to part 1 add spices, molasses and walnuts. Put batter by table-spoonfuls into 9" tube pan alternating light and dark mixtures. Bake in 350° for one hour. Frost with favorite frosting, decorate with walnuts.
