**Frozen Fruit Salad**

- 1 can fruit cocktail
- 1 small can evaporated milk
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice

Blend sugar and flour with juice from fruit cocktail; cook until thickened. Chill. Whip evaporated milk (which has been thoroughly chilled in refrigerator) with rotary beater, add lemon juice, and beat one moment. Stir in fruit, thickened juice and may-

onnaise. Pour into refrigerator trays and freeze. Cut in squares, serve with mayonnaise.

- 1/2 cup butter or Spry
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 6 tablespoons cocoa
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup chopped walnut meats

Melt butter. Beat eggs and add sugar, then other dry ingredients. Add butter, extract and nut meats. Combine thoroughly and bake in shallow pan in moderately slow oven (325°) 20 to 30 minutes. Turn out and cut in bars. Cover to retain chewy quality.
