HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Now that school is over for another three months and the children will be home all day, they naturally will be bringing their neighbors over to play. It would be very handy to have the cookie jar filled at all times. The following are some tempting recipes that you will enjoy as well as the children.

COCONUT MACAROONS.

3/4 cup Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk
1 teaspoon vanilla (optional)
Mix Eagle Brand sweetened condensed milk and coconut. Add vanilla, if desired. Drop from tablespoon on greased baking sheet, about 1 inch apart. Deco-

rate with raisins, walnuts or cherries, if desired. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 2 minutes or until brown. Remove from pan at once. Makes about 30 macaroons.

Sour Cream Caramel Drops.

1 cup butter or shortening
2 cups brown sugar
2 eggs well beaten
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup sour cream
2 teaspoons of cinnamon
1 teaspoon of nutmeg
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
4 cups of sifted flour

Cream shortening and sugar until light and fluffy, fold in beaten eggs, vanilla and sour cream, sift spices, baking powder, soda, salt and flour together and stir in. Drop from teaspoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake in oven (425) until lightly browned, about 10 minutes.
