"The Voice" Special Luncheon Dish

- 1 cup cooked macaroni
- 1 cup bread crumbs
- 1 cup grated cheese
- 1 cup cream (canned)
- 1/2 cup melted butter
- 3 tablespoons chopped parsley
- 3 tablespoons chopped pimento
- 1 small onion, chopped fine
- 3 egg yolks, well beaten

Mix well; fold in egg whites. Bake in stem cake pan, in pan of boiling water in moderate oven until brown. About 40 minutes.

SAUCE

Nootsie's Gingerbread

- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 cup hot water
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg, cinnamon, ginger and vanilla
- 1 1/2 cups flour

Mix in order except put soda in hot water. This will appear thin but it's ok.

Vegetable and Sausage Casserole

- 1 lb. small link sausage.
- 4 or 5 potatoes (quartered)
- 4 or 5 carrots (quartered)
- 2 medium sized onions
- 1 can tomato soup
- 1/4 cup water

Place vegetables and link sausages in casserole. Pour tomato soup and water over this mixture. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) for two hours, or until vegetables are tender. Serves 4.
