

COLUMBUS, O. (ANP). Dr. John A. Davis, political science professor at Lincoln (Pa.) university, will work during the 1950-51 school year as visiting lecturer at Ohio State university.

His appointment marks the first time this university has employed a Negro teacher above the rank of graduate assistant. Dr. Davis is the brother of Dr. Allison Davis, a professor at the University of Chicago.

At Ohio State, the Lincoln instructor will replace Dr. E. Allen Adams who is to be a visiting lecturer at Oxford university in England during the coming year.

Dr. Davis was graduated from Williams college in 1933, the University of Wisconsin the following year with his master's degree. Last year he received his Ph.D. at Columbia university.

In public life he has served as assistant director of the New York Commission against Discrimination and on the wartime federal fair employment practices committee.
