Old-Fashioned Rice Pudding

1/2 cup raw white rice, washed
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1 qt. milk
1/2 cup seedless raisins
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon vanilla

Heat oven to 325° F. (moderate). Mix ingredients in 2-qt. casserole. Bake uncovered at 325° F. 3 hours. Serve warm or cold. Top with dot of bright red jelly and top milk. Makes 4 to 6 servings. Serve leftover pudding with fruit next day.

Barbecue Squares

1 1/2 pounds ground beef
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon celery salt
2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
1 beaten egg
1 cup milk
1 cup soft bread crumbs
Combine ingredients and mix well. Shape in 1-inch-thick pat-

ties and place in 8-inch square shallow baking dish. Place a slice of onion on each patty. Pour over **Hot Sauce:** Cook 1/2 cup chopped onion in hot fat until golden. Add 1 6-ounce can (3/4 cup) tomato paste, 1 clove garlic, chopped, 1 tablespoon chopped green pepper, 1 tablespoon sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/8 teaspoon pepper, 2 teaspoons Tobasco sauce, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 1/2 tablespoons chili powder, 1/4 cup lemon juice, and 1 cup water. Heat to boiling. Simmer 15 minutes. Pour over meat. Bake in moderate oven (350°) 1 hour. aBste frequently. Serves 6 to 8.
