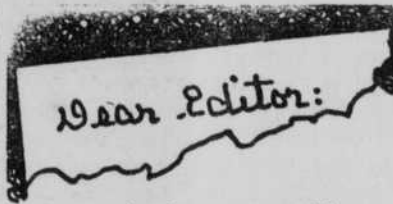
**L. A. Honors Dr. Bunche**

**Toasted Croquettes**

- 2 cups mashed sweet potatoes
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6 marshmallows
- 1/2 cup cereal flake crumbs

Blend mashed sweet potatoes and seasonings. Shape in balls around marshmallow. Roll in crumbs and brown in moderate oven (350°) 15 minutes. Or dig in egg, then crumbs, and deep-fat fry. Makes 6.

**Small Rich Fruit Cake**

- 1/2 cup butter or margarine
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon cloves
- 1 cup chopped mixed candied fruits
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup strong coffee
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 1/2 teaspoon each nutmeg and allspice
- 1 pound raisins
- 1 cup chopped dates

Sift flour and measure. Sift flour, salt, soda and spices together and mix with fruit. Cream butter or margarine with sugar. Beat eggs until light and add. Add fruit and flour mixture

alternately with coffee and molasses.

Put batter in greased waxed paper-lined loaf pan. Bake in slow oven, 275 degrees, 3 hours. Put a pan of water in the oven during the first hour of baking. Makes 4 pounds.
