cup butter or margarine 3 eggs 1 teaspoon soda 1 teaspoon cinnamon 4 teaspoon cloves 1 cup chopped mixed candied fruits 1 cup brown sugar 4 cup strong coffee 5 teaspoon salt 5 cup molasses 5 teaspoon each nutmeg and alispice 1 pound raisins 1 cup chopped dates

Sift flour and measure. Sift flour, salt, soda and spices together and mix with fruit. Cream butter or margarine with sugar. Beat eggs until light and add. Add fruit and flour mixture



alternately with coffee and molasses.

Put batter in greased waxed paper-lined loaf pan. Bake in slow oven, 275 degrees, 3 hours. Put a pan of water in the oven during the first hour of baking. Makes 4 pounds.
