2 cups sugar 1 cup molasses or syrup

1 teaspoon vinegar Butter size of an

Boil together sugar, molasses, vinegar and butter. Cook until it hardens when dropped in water. Pour as quickly as possible over 8 quarts of popped corn. Mould into balls. To tint red and green. Divide the syrup in two parts and color with food coloring.

Popcorn Corsages
1 c. sugar ½ t.
½ c. water 1 T.
1 t. vinegar 1 t.
2 T. light corn cosyrup 6 c. sages
½ t. salt
1 T. butter
1 t. red food
coloring
6 c. popped corn

Combine sugar, water, vinegar, corn syrup and salt; stir until sugar dissolves. Cook to very hardball stage (265 degrees). Remove from heat; add butter and coloring. Reserve small amount of syrup for fastening wooden skewers. Pour over popped corn, mixing constantly. Form in 2 inch balls. Dip skewers into syrup; push into balls. Back with a lace paper doily and cellephane circles. Tie cellophane bows. Makes
