With Christmas just 10 days away, I'm sure a few quick, tasty goodies will help get you in the spirit of the holiday season.

POPCORN—

Popcorn Balls
2 cups sugar 1 teaspoon
1 cup molasses 1/2 cup vinegar
or syrup Butter size of an egg

Boil together sugar, molasses, vinegar and butter. Cook until it hardens when dropped in water. Pour as quickly as possible over 8 quarts of popped corn. Mould into balls. To tint red and green. Divide the syrup in two parts and color with food coloring.

Popcorn Corsages

1 c. sugar 1/2 t. salt
1/2 c. water 1 T. butter
1 t. vinegar 1 t. red food coloring
2 T. light corn syrup 6 c. popped corn

Combine sugar, water, vinegar, corn syrup and salt; stir until sugar dissolves. Cook to very hard-ball stage (265 degrees). Remove from heat; add butter and coloring. Reserve small amount of syrup for fastening wooden skewers. Pour over popped corn, mixing constantly. Form in 2 inch balls. Dip skewers into syrup; push into balls. Back with a lace paper doily and cellophane circles. Tie cellophane bows. Makes 16.

CANDIES—

Christmas Caramels

2 cups sugar 1/2 cup light syrup
2 cups light brown corn 1/4 lb. butter
1 pint cream

CHICAGO. (ANP). Former heavyweight champion Joe Louis will return to the ring for the third leg of his comeback, Jan. 3 in Detroit. His opponent will be Freddy Beshore, who has lost his last two fights.
