Plum Pudding

- 1 cup finely chopped suet
- 1 cup plus 2 tablespoons brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 eggs, well beaten
- 1 cup seedless raisins
- 1/2 cups currants
- 1/2 cup chopped blanched almonds
- 1 cup mixed diced candied fruit
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon allspice

Combine suet, brown sugar and milk. Add eggs. Combine raisins, currants, almonds and candied fruits with one-fourth cup of the flour. Mix and sift remaining flour, baking soda, salt and spices. Add fruit mixture, bread crumbs and flour mixture to sugar mixture; mix well. Turn into well

greased mold. Cover mold tightly. Steam 2 1/2 hours. Serves 10 to 12. Serve with sauce.

In a pressure sauce pan, steam without pressure 30 minutes and 50 minutes at 15 pounds pressure. Dry puddings 15 minutes in a moderate oven, 350 degrees.

Mincemeat Spicy Peach Pie

- 1 9-ounce package mincemeat
- 1 1/2 cups peach juice, water added to make required quantity
- 1 recipe plain pastry
- 1 cup drained, canned peaches, sliced
- 1/4 cup lemon juice

Break mincemeat in pieces. Add combined peach juice and water. Place over low heat. Stir until mixture is smooth. Bring to brisk boil. Boil 1 minute. Cool. Line 9-inch pie pan with plain pastry. Fill with mincemeat mixture. Place peaches on top of mincemeat. Sprinkle with lemon juice. Moisten edge of crust with water. Cover with upper crust. Trim. Press edges together. Cut several gashes in top crust. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) about 35 minutes.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

When a child is sick in bed, pin an old shoe bag (the kind with several pockets) to the mattress. This will hold small toys, crayons, color books, and other play equipment. You'll save yourself steps.

A ball of steel wool covered with a piece of bright material makes an excellent pincushion and keeps needles sharp.

Wax the snow shovel to prevent snow from sticking to it. This makes shoveling much easier.

To prevent paint running down the handle of a brush when you're doing a ceiling, roll a stocking all the way from top to heel. Slide the brush handle down in the foot

Floors and work surfaces keep tidy while sewing if you tape a paper bag to one end of sewing machine cabinet into which you can whisk the bits of thread, and cloth snippings as they accumulate.

Pour pancake batter from a glass measuring cup on to griddle. You can pour out the exact amount for each pancake.

Try using adhesive tape instead of corks for salt and pepper shakers. The corks slip inside and sometimes are not available in the right size.

Mark part-empty paint cans by painting a line on the outside to indicate the level of remaining amount. Thus you can tell at a glance, the color and amount of paint in the can.

When cutting wax paper for cakepans, cut out several pieces at once and place in a large folder ready for the next baking time.
