The Missouri Supreme court upheld this decision ordering Wesley to go because he was qualified. The court also was notified that Hadley had dropped the course, so remanded it to Judge Robert L. Aronson with orders to dismiss the suit if the subject was no longer taught.

Philip J. Hickey, superintendent of instruction, did order the course dropped, giving no reason, and Judge Aronson had no other course to take but dismiss the action. Equipment for the course has been stored.
