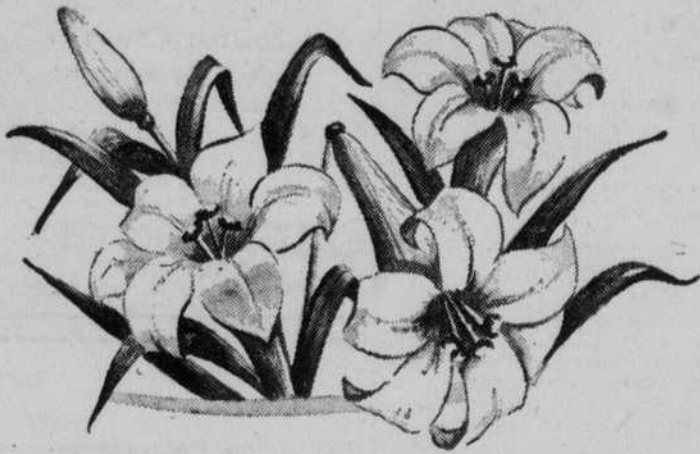

A most impressive fact about the resurrection of Jesus was the effect on His disciples. In the place of disappointment, despair and sorrow, came joy, hope and courage. Jesus' victory was won at the cost of the cross. His victory is our victory. It has its effect on all our life, makes us different as individuals. It is a spiritual force in our lives. Through fellowship with the risen Christ we may rise from a death in sin to a life of holiness. It is also a prophecy and hope and assurance of future life. A man may live a good life without this hope, but if he is to live his best, he must have this assurance of immortality. Lt. Leon Gilbert to Begin 20-Year Term
TOKYO. (ANP). Lt. Leon A. Gilbert, company officer of the 24th Infantry regiment, who was convicted by court martial on a charge of refusing to obey orders to attack with his unit in Korea last July 31, left here recently aboard the U.S. transport Gen. William Mitchell bound for a federal penitentiary in the United States to begin a 20 year prison term.

Gilbert was originally sentenced by the court martial board to die, but the sentence was commuted by President Truman, following a nationwide protest. The officer denied the charge and contended that his trial had been conducted in an illegal manner. As a direct result of this case, the NAACP assigned its national counsel, Thurgood Marshall, to make an on-the-spot investigation. Marshall reported that he found many similar cases involving discriminatory punishment of Negro GI's.

The NAACP has announced plans to continue the fight to reverse the court martial verdict and secure Gilbert's reinstatement to his commission.

Let me review my visit with you and see if I can't summarize my views professionally for you with these terse statements: **GAIN BROADER SUPPORT** for the Omaha Urban League through the enlistment of more civic leaders. This selling job calls for the expanding of effort by others than ministers and social workers. It calls for the best in a community's leadership. Sell local leadership on what this program means to the community and the nation, far beyond justice for Negro citizens. Emphasize the "you" element in the general, over-all appeal of the League. Expose all of the people to the knowledge of the personal and general benefits and values that will result from equal rights and opportunities for all. Upgrading one group upgrades all groups. **BROADEN AND INTENSIFY** your work among children. Many adults are beyond salvation. I know of some of the fine work being done in the schools. Keep in mind always: On the future thinking and action of the children—the citizens of tomorrow—rests the ultimate decision. Concentrate your programming on these future citizens. Our destiny is in their hands. I am willing to

trust their judgment if they have the chance to be adequately informed.
