Chocolate Almond Refrigerator Cake

1 cup whipping cream
1/2 cup finely chopped chocolate covered almonds
16 graham crackers
8 whole chocolate covered almonds

Whip 1/2 cream stiff. Add chopped almonds. Spread on crackers. Stack together to make loaf. Wrap in waxed paper. Chill overnight. Just before serving whip remainder of cream, spread on loaf; garnish with almonds. (Serves 4).

Frozen Banana Salad

2 pkts. cream cheese
1 tsp. salt
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1 cup whipping cream
Crisp lettuce leaves

Mix cream cheese with salt, mayonnaise, and lemon juice. Add pineapple, sliced bananas, nut meats, and cherries. Fold in whipped cream and pour into refrigerator freezing tray. When frozen, serve in slices on crisp lettuce leaves. Garnish with fresh fruit. Serves 6.

Make Noodle Ring as Follows:

2 tbsp. butter
1 tsp. salt
3 egg yolks
1/2 tsp. pepper
1/2 cup hot milk
3 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Cook noodles. Add butter, salt, pepper, hot milk, and egg yolks. Fold in whites last. Pour mixture into buttered ring mold. Set in pan of hot water and bake in 325 degree F. oven for 30 minutes.

Creamed Eggs and Chicken in Noodle Ring

4 hard-cooked eggs
1 cup diced cooked chicken
2 oz. can mushrooms
1 1/2 cups white sauce
Parsley
6 stuffed olives

Make white sauce. Shell hard cooked eggs and cut in quarters lengthwise. Pour white sauce over eggs and diced chicken—heat. Add olives which are sliced. Sauté mushrooms in a small amount of butter.
