Hunters with dogs will probably experience the easiest going and the fullest bags.

There are some hail strips in the open area where the pheasant population has been hit. There are likewise some limited areas where heavy flooding has seriously damaged the pheasant populyation. These mentioned areas are, however, few and far between.

As the season progresses, pheasants will tend to bunch. Sexes seporate; hens gather in larger groups and roosters bunch in small groups. If you flush a group of hens, you might as well move on and hunt another area. Paul Gilbert, executive secretary of the Game Commission, ad-
