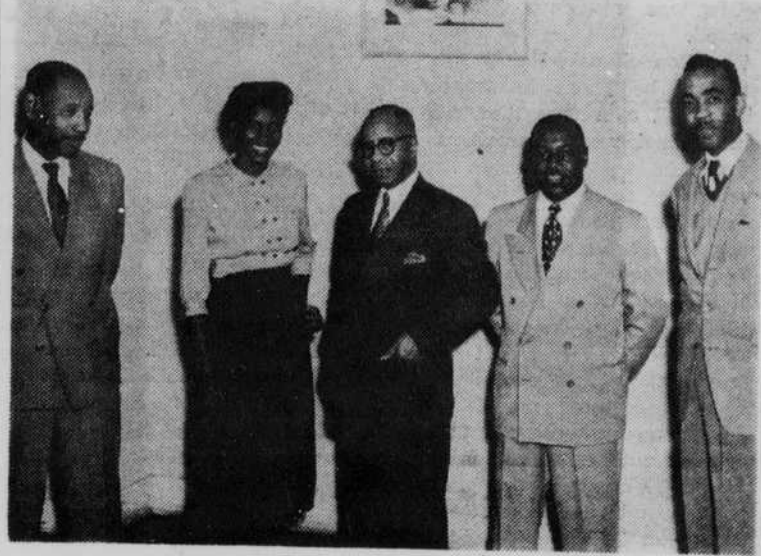

CHICAGO. (ANP). Five Negroes were among persons who attended a conference of the National Mid-Century Committee for Children and Youth which met at the Shoreland hotel here last week.

They were Atty. Sadie T. M. Alexander, Philadelphia; De Benjamin E. Mays, president of Morehouse college; Ernest E. Neal, Council on Rural Life, Tuskegee institute; Carter W. Wesley, publisher, Houston, Tex., and Dr. Ira De A. Reid, Haverford college.

Leonard W. Mayo was chairman of the meeting which is an outgrowth of the White House Conference for Children and Youth, which met in Washington last year. Delegates at the meeting represented various state advisory committees.

Other leaders included Benjamin Youngdahl of St. Louis; John

J. McClaserty, dean of the School of Social Sciences, Catholic university, Washington; Robert E. Bondy, Social Welfare Assembly, New York; and George W. Miles of San Antonio, Tex.
