Let's Have a "Chicken Good Time"

Crusty Herb-fried Chicken

One 3-to-3½-pound chicken—½ tsp. thyme—½ tsp. marjoram—flour—fat—½ tsp. rosemary—2 tbsp. fresh minced parsley—1 tsp. salt—¼ tsp. pepper—½ cup hot water. — Cut chicken in serving pieces. Sprinkle with thyme and marjoram; let stand ½ to 1 hour. Roll in flour and fry in ¼ inch hot fat just long enough to brown on both sides. Remove each piece as it browns and place in shallow pan. Sprinkle with rosemary, parsley, salt, and pepper. Pour hot water in frying pan; stir thoroughly. Pour over chicken. Bake uncovered in moderately hot oven (375) about 45 minutes. Serves 6.

Spanish Chicken

One 2-to-2½-pound chicken—1 cup chopped onion—2 cloves garlic, minced ½ cup diced green pepper—½ cup pimiento, cut in strips, 1 cup uncooked rice—½ cups chicken bouillon—1½ tsp. turmeric—dash chili powder—1 tsp. salt—pepper. Cut chicken in serving pieces. Roll in seasoned flour and brown in hot fat. Remove from skillet. Cook onion, garlic, and green pepper in remaining hot fat till onion is golden. Add pimiento and rice; stir over low heat about 2 minutes. Add remaining ingredients. Heat to boiling. Pour into 2-quart casserole; arrange chicken on top. Bake in moderate oven (350) 1½ hours.

Party Chicken Ring

¼ cup butter—½ cup enriched flour—1 tsp. salt—3 cups chicken stock—½ cup milk—1 tsp. lemon juice—pepper, paprika—3 cups diced cooked chicken — ½ cup sliced stuffed olives — 2 tbsp. chopped pimiento. Melt butter; stir in flour. Add salt, stock, milk. Cook over low heat till thick, stirring constantly. Add remaining ingredients. Heat. Biscuit ring. Sift together 1½ cups enriched flour, 1 tbs. baking powder, tsp. salt, and ½ tsp. poultry seasoning. Cut in ¼ cup shortening. Stir in ½ cup plus 2 tbsp. milk. Bake in greased 2 inch ring mold in hot oven (450) 15 minutes. Brush with butter; fill with the hot chicken.

Chicken Pie With Yam Biscuits.

1½ cups diced cooked chicken—½ cup diced cooked carrots—6 small cooked onions—1 tsp. parsley—½ cup evaporated milk—1 10½ or 11-ounce can cream of chicken soup — 2 tbsp. enriched flour—½ tsp. salt—¼ tsp. pepper. Place chicken and vegetables in 1½-quart casserole. Add milk to half of soup. Heat to boiling point. Blend flour and seasoning with remaining soup. Stir into hot mixture. Cook till thickened. Pour into casserole. Top with Yam biscuits. Bake in moderate oven (350) 45 minutes. Yam Biscuits: Sift together 1 cup enriched flour, ½ tsp. salt, 2 tsp. baking powder. Combine 1 cup cooked, mashed yams, ½ cup melted butter or margarine, and 1 beaten egg. Add dry ingredients. Blend. Drop biscuits from spoon.
