Remember that Instant Coffee you bought and didn't like? Lets use it up:

**Coffee Float**

½ cup sugar, 2 cups water, dash salt, 1' tbsps. instant coffee, 1 pint vanilla ice cream, carbonated water. Combine sugar, water, and salt. Simmer 5 minutes. Dissolve coffee in hot liquid. Cool thoroughly. Pour into 4 tall glasses. Mix a tbsp. icecream with coffee mixture in each glass. Fill almost to top with carbonated water. Slip a scoop of ice cream in each.

**Brazilian Fluff**

1 envelope unflavored gelatine, ¼ cup cold water, ½ cup hot water, ½ cup sugar, 1 cup hot milk, 1 tsp. instant coffee, 1 cup heavy cream, whipped. ½ cup, toasted, slivered almonds, ½ tsp. vanilla. Soften gelatine in cold water; dissolve in hot water. Melt sugar in heavy skillet over low heat till clear and medium brown. Remove from heat. Add milk. Stir over low heat until lumps dissolve. Add milk mixture and instant coffee to gelatine. Chill till partially set; beat until frothy. Fold in whipped cream, almonds, and vanilla. spoon into serving dishes. Chill. Garnish with whole almonds. Serves 6.

**Coffee Chiffon Pie**

1 envelope unflavored gelatine, ¼ cup cold water, ½ cup sugar, 1 tbsp. instant coffee, 3 well beaten egg yolks, 1 cup water, ¼ tsp. salt, 3 stiff-beaten egg whites ½ cup sugar, 1 tsp. vanilla, 1 10 inch baked pie shell. Soften gelatine in cold water. Sift together ½ cup sugar and coffee beat into egg yolks. Gradually stir in water and salt. Cook over boiling water 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Add gelatine; stir until dissolved. Chill till mixture slightly thickens. Gradually beat remaining ½ cup sugar into egg whites. Stir in vanilla. Fold into coffee gelatine. Pour into baked 10 inch pie shell. Chill. Garnish with walnuts.

Coffee Seven-Minute Frosting  
2 egg whites, 1½ cups sugar, ¼

tsp. cream of tartar, ¼ cup cold water, dash of salt, 2 tsp. instant coffee, ⅛ tsp. cinnamon, 1 tsp. vanilla. Place all ingredients except vanilla in double boiler over hot water. Mix thoroughly. Cook beating constantly with rotary or electric beater, until mixture forms peaks, about 7 minutes. Remove from heat. Add vanilla. Beat until mixture is of spreading consistency.

Wright, Omaha, "Some Clinical Features of Emphysema" and Dr. Jerome Ritter, Lincoln, "Chronic Rheumatic Mediastinitis."
