Here's Spring Cleaning Hint: Use A Broom For Rug Shampoo



Spring cleaning time is here again, but it needn't be bad news for a housekeeper who knows how to make a single tool do the work of many.

Take the reliable broomcorn broom, for instance. In addition to its sweeping uses, the broomcorn broom can be used for shampooing a rug. To do this, sweep away the surface dirt, spread detergent suds over a small area and sweep it into the nap. Wipe up the suds with a soft cloth before the rug backing becomes wet, and proceed to the next area. Try the suds on an inconspicuous spot first to make sure your rug or carpet is colorfast.

Another use for the broom is to cover it with a soft cloth and clean cobwebs from ceilings. Also use it for beating rugs or smothering grass fires.

When your broom is worn out, use the handle as a window prop, a garden stake, a curtain rod, as a rod for hanging clothes, or for hanging a dripping jelly bag.

Whiskbrooms made of broomcorn have a variety of uses around the backyard barbecue pit, garden house and automobile—use it indoors for stairway banisters, draperies, crevices of chairs, and the fireplace.
