BATON ROUGE—Charles Edward Harrington, 38, is scheduled to be the first Negro ever to march in a graduation ceremony at Louisiana State University this week when he receives his master of education degree in supervision and administration.

A native of Magnolia, Miss., he was graduated from Southern University in 1941, served four years in the Army during World War II, spent one summer study-

St. Louis Univ. Cites Bunche

ST. LOUIS — Dr. Ralph J. Bunche, winner of the 1950 Nobel Prize for Peace and director of the United Nations Department of Trusteeship, was cited this week for his "great humanitarianism, his insight into the relations of mankind, his sound judgment in the ordering of public affairs, and his warmth of intelligent fellowship," when he received the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws from St. Louis University.

Dr. Bunche delivered the address at the university's 134th commencement, at which 1,650 persons received degrees.

Negroes File School Suit In N. C.

WILLIAMS TON — (ANP) — A suit was filed last week against the Martin County Board of education charging discrimination all along the line and asking for compensatory and \$500,000 punitive damages.

Also named as defendants in the suit were members of the North Carolina State Board of Education. J. C. Manning is county superintendent.

The action was taken by 19 plaintiffs seeking relief from what they term discriminatory practices of the school officials. They claim that there are inequalities between the white and Negro public schools in the county.

The suit was filed in the Eastern Federal court at Washington, N. C.

The petitioners, located mostly in one community in the county, seek mandatory action of the court or an injunction restraining the county from continuing its discriminatory practices.

The defendants have 20 days in which to file an answer to the suit, one of the largest ever brought in Martin county.
