Mushroom Omelet

4 eggs, beaten
3 tbsp. thin cream
1/4 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
2 tbsp. butter
1 cup mushrooms

METHOD: Beat eggs, cream and seasonings until well mixed. Pour into hot pan with the butter melted in it, cook quickly, shaking pan to cook the eggs evenly. Lift edges of omelet with knife to let the soft part run down into the pan. When almost done, but still a little shiny, fold in the mushrooms which have been sliced in lengthwise halves and sauteed in 2 tbsp. butter for 5 minutes. Lay boiled ham strips across top.

Spring Casserole

8 baby carrots
1 small cauliflower
1 cup fresh peas
1/2 lb. soft cheese
2 cups medium white sauce
Chopped parsley

METHOD: Cook vegetables (cauliflower broken into flower-lets) in boiling salted water until tender. Drain. Place in greased casserole. Melt the cheese in well seasoned hot white sauce; pour it over vegetables. Bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees F. until thoroughly heated. Serve garnished with parsley.

SALT PORK PANCAKES

6 to 8 slices salt pork 4 eggs, beaten
2 c. sifted flour 2 c. milk
1/2 tsp. salt Maple sugar

METHOD: Fry pork to delicate brown. Place flour and salt in bowl, add beaten eggs and milk, beat until smooth. Pour some of the batter over each slice of salt pork on a griddle and bake until browned on one side, turn and brown on the other side. Serve very hot on heated plates, with maple sugar or syrup.
