QUESTION: I am planning to construct a masonry fireplace in my new home and would like to know whether the firebrick must be laid in cement morter or in fire clay. If fireclay, what is the proper way of mixing it?

D.K., Uniondale, L. I., N. Y.

ANSWER: When firebrick are laid in mortar, cracks usually develop in a short while. Fire clay is better, more enduring. Mix the dry, powdered clay with water to the consistency of putty, or mortar—an easily workable mixture. Do not build a fire before 48 hours have

QUESTION: I am unable to get paint to adhere satisfactorily to the house in which I live. I use the best quality paints, yet now it is beginning to peel again. I have been advised to use sheliac by one person—an undercoat of aluminum paint by another person. Can you offer a solution to my problem?

QUESTION: Can you tell me how to refinish a mirror that has spots showing through from the back which mar the clear vision? There must be some solution for this purpose.
