INGREDIENTS

1 package instant cake mix
1/2 cup milk
1 1/2 cups raisin bran
1/4 teaspoon butter (at room temperature)
1/4 teaspoon almond extract
Turn cake mix into bowl. Add remaining ingredients and beat 2 minutes. (Beat vigorously by hand or at a medium speed of electric mixer.) Drop from teaspoon onto ungreased baking sheet at least 2 inches apart. Decorate top of each cookie with a raisin. Bake in moderate oven (375 degrees F.) 8 to 10 minutes, or until done. (Cookies
