Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nobraska,
Section 1. That at the general election in November 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the followsing amendment to Article XVI, section 2, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:
"Sec. 2. When three-fifths of the members elected to the Legislature deem it necessary to call a convention to revise, amend, or change this constitution, they shall recommend to the electors to vote at the next election of members of the Legislature, for or against a convention, and if a majority of the electors voting on the
