Praise Work of Colored Nurses in Polio

WASHINGTON — (ANP)—Negro nurses came in for special praise recently by Miss Ann Magnusse, director of American National Red Cross Nursing Services, as she made a plea for replacements of polio nurses who have been called back to the school room by the opening of schools.

"Colored nurses are already at work in cities hard hit by polio in the states of Illinois, Minnesota and Iowa," said Miss Magnusse.

"We urge qualified women to enroll for duty through local Red Cross chapters wherever needed." It is hoped that the danger point of the season is past but nurses will continue to be needed for polio patients who require day and night attention.

"Salaries and expenses of polio

nurses are paid by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. As of Aug. 16, 1952, there were 16,447 reported cases of polio in the United States, a figure equaling totals reached in the 1949 epidemic, one of the most severe in the history of the nation.

"Red Cross especially urges registered professional nurses to respond to our appeal for help. No special experience is required but nurses recruited by Red Cross are requested to serve for a minimum of two months."

Scholarships Available for Young Pianists, Composers

NEW YORK—(ANP)—Applications now are being accepted for the fourth annual Chopin scholarships for talented young pianists and composers, the Kosciuszko Foundation, sponsors of the awards, announced this week.

The foundation will present two awards of \$1,000 each. One to a pianist between the ages of 15 and 21 and the other to a composer between the ages of 17 and 30.

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That at the general election in November 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article III, section 19, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature: "Sec. 19. The Legislature shall never grant any extra compensation to any public officer, agent, or servant after the services have been rendered nor to any contractor after the contract has been entered into, nor shall the compensation of any public officer, including any officer whose compensation is fixed by the Legislature, be increased or diminished during his term of office except that, when there are officers elected or appointed to a court, board, or commission having more than one member and the terms of one or more members commence and end at different times, the compensation of all members of such court, board, or commission may be increased or diminished at the beginning of the full term of any member thereof."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article VIII, section 1, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:

"Sec. 1. The necessary revenue of the state and its governmental subdivisions shall be raised by taxation in such manner as the Legislature may direct. Taxes shall be levied by valuation uniformly and proportionately upon all tangible property, and franchises, except that the Legislature may provide for a different method of taxing motor vehicles. Provided, that such tax proceeds from motor vehicles taxed in each county shall be allocated to the state, counties, townships, villages, and school districts of such county in the same proportion that the levy of each bears to the total levy of said county on personal tangible property. Taxes uniform as to class may be levied by valuation upon all other property, taxes, other than

property taxes, may be authorized by law. Existing revenue laws shall continue in effect until changed by the Legislature."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, for approval, the following amendment to Article III, section 7, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature.

"Sec. 7. Members of the Legislature shall be elected for a term of two years beginning at noon on the first Tuesday in January in the year next ensuing the general election at which they were elected. Each member shall be nominated and elected in a non-partisan manner and without any indication on the ballot that he is affiliated with or endorsed by any political party or organization. Each member shall receive and be paid the sum of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars per annum, payable in such manner and at such times as may be provided by law. In addition to his salary, each member shall receive and be paid an amount equal to his actual expenses in traveling by the most usual route once to and returning from each regular or special session of the Legislature. Members of the Legislature shall receive no pay nor perquisites other than said salary and expenses. Employees of the Legislature shall receive no compensation other than their salary or per diem."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the amendments to the Constitution of Nebraska which are set forth in section 2 of this act, and which are hereby proposed by the Legislature.

Sec. 2. The amendments proposed are as follows:

(1) To add four new sections, to appear in Article VII of the Constitution of Nebraska, as sections 14, 15, 16, and 17, and to read as follows:

"Sec. 14. There is hereby established a State Department of Education which shall be comprised of a State Board of Education and a Commissioner of Education. The State Department of Education shall have general supervision and administration of the school system of the state and of such other activities as the Legislature may direct."

"Sec. 15. The State Board of Edu-

cation shall be composed of six members, who shall be elected from six districts as provided by the Legislature. Their term of office shall be for six years each, except as hereinafter provided. Their duties and powers shall be prescribed by the Legislature, and they shall receive no compensation, but shall be reimbursed their actual expense incurred in the performance of their duties. The members of the State Board of Education shall not be actively engaged in the educational profession and they shall be elected on a nonpartisan ballot. In the general election of 1954, six members shall be elected to the board, one from each of the six districts; two members shall be elected for two years, two for four years, and two for six years. In each general election thereafter two members shall be elected for six year terms from districts as prescribed by the Legislature."

"Sec. 16. The State Board of Education shall appoint and fix the compensation of the Commissioner of Education, who shall be the Executive Officer of the State Board of Education and the administrative head of the State Department of Education, and who shall have such powers and duties as the Legislature may direct. The board shall appoint all employees of the State Department of Education on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Education."

"Sec. 17. All provisions in the Constitution of Nebraska and laws of the state relating to the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall, insofar as such provisions are applicable, apply to and mean the State Department of Education, the State Board of Education, or the Commissioner of Education, as the case may be."

(2) To amend Article IV, section 1, to read as follows:

"Sec. 1. The executive officers of the state shall be the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, Treasurer, Attorney General, and the heads of such other executive departments as set forth herein or as may be established by law. The Legislature may provide for the placing of the above named officers as heads over such departments of government as it may by law establish. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Auditor of Public Accounts, and Treasurer shall be chosen at the general election held in November, 1954, and in each even-numbered year thereafter, and their term of office shall be two years and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. The records, books, and papers of all executive officers shall be kept at the seat of government, and such officers, excepting the Lieutenant Governor, shall reside there during their respective terms of office. Officers in the executive department of the state shall perform such duties as may be provided by law. The heads of all executive departments established by law, other than those to be elected as provided herein, shall be appointed by the Governor, with the consent of a majority of all members elected to the Legislature, but officers so appointed may be removed by the Governor. Subject to the provisions of this Constitution, the heads of the various executive or civil departments shall have power to appoint and remove all subordinate employees in their respective departments."

(3) To amend Article VII, section 1, to read as follows:

"Sec. 1. The Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Attorney General, and Commissioner of Education shall, under the direction of the Legislature, constitute a board of commissioners for the sale, leasing, and general management of all lands and funds set apart for educational purposes, and for the investment of school funds in such manner as may be prescribed by law."

(4) To amend Article VII, section 13, to read as follows:

"Sec. 13. The general government of the state normal schools as now existing, and such other normal schools as may be established by law, shall be vested, under the direction of the Legislature, in a board of seven members to be styled Board of Education of State Normal Schools, six of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislature, two each for a term of two, four, and six years, and two each biennium thereafter for a term of six years, and the Commissioner of Education shall be a member ex officio. The duties and powers of the board shall be prescribed by law, and the members thereof shall receive no compensation for the performance of their duties, but may be reimbursed their actual expenses incurred therein."

(5) To amend Article XVII, section 3, to read as follows:

"Sec. 3. Unless otherwise provided by law the salary of the Lieutenant Governor shall be twice the salary of a member of the Legislature."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. That at the general election in November 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article XVI, section 2, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:

"Sec. 2. When three-fifths of the members elected to the Legislature deem it necessary to call a convention to revise, amend, or change this constitution, they shall recommend to the electors to vote at the next election of members of the Legislature, for or against a convention, and if a majority of the electors voting on the proposition, vote for a convention, the Legislature shall, at its next session provided by law for calling the same; Provided, the votes cast in favor of calling a convention shall not be less than thirty-five per cent of the total votes cast at such election. The convention shall consist of not more than one hundred members, the exact number to be determined by the Legislature, and to be nominated and elected from districts in the manner to be prescribed by the Legislature. Such members shall meet within three months after their election, for the purpose aforesaid. No amendment of this constitution, agreed upon by such convention, shall take effect until the same has been submitted to the electors of the state, and adopted by a majority of those voting for or against the same."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. At the general election in November 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article XVI, section 1, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:

"Sec. 1. The Legislature may propose amendments to this Constitution. If the same be agreed to by three-fifths of the members elected to the Legislature, such proposed amendments shall be entered on the journal, with the yeas and nays, and published once each week for three consecutive weeks, in at least one newspaper in each county, where a newspaper is published, immediately preceding the next election of members of the Legislature. At such election said amendments shall be submitted to the electors for approval or rejection upon a ballot separate from that upon which the names of candidates appear. If a majority of the electors voting on any such amendment adopt the same, it shall become a part of this Constitution, provided the votes cast in favor of such amendment shall not be less than thirty-five per cent of the total votes cast at such election. When two or more amendments are submitted at the same election, they shall be so submitted as to enable the electors to vote on each amendment separately."
