Mrs. Roosevelt Tells UNESCO Meaning

WASHINGTON (ANP) — The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization has the responsibility of teaching the people of the United States to understand the rest of the world declared Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt last week.
The former First Lady spoke on "Public Opinion and the United Nations" before a group of citizens meeting in Washington to examine the program and activities of UNESCO.
The attacks on the UN and UNESCO are due to misunderstanding said Mrs. Roosevelt. There is a great need for education at home because America has become a symbol of Democracy, she said.

Whatever happens in the United States is considered by the rest of the world as the "meaning of democracy." Incidents which happen in this country are picked up from our papers by the Soviets who say, "that's what Democracy means."
The three day meeting of the National Commission for UNESCO, held in the state department, was attended by 100 prominent leaders representing education, science, the arts, literature, the theatre, mass communications, religion, business, labor, youth and civic organizations.
The five Negro members attending were Judge Homer S. Brown of Pittsburgh; Dr. John Hope Franklin, professor of history, Howard university; Ernest M.

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,
Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska, for approval, the following amendment to Article III, section 7, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:
"Sec. 7. Members of the Legislature shall be elected for a term of two years beginning at noon on the first Tuesday in January in the year next ensuing the general election at which they were elected. Each member shall be nominated and elected in a non-partisan manner and without any indication on the ballot that he is affiliated with or endorsed by any political party or organization. Each member shall receive and be paid the sum of one thousand two hundred fifty dollars per annum, payable in such manner and at such times as may be provided by law. In addition to his salary, each member shall receive and be paid an amount equal to his actual expenses in traveling by the most usual route once to and returning from each regular or special session of the Legislature. Members of the Legislature shall receive no pay nor perquisites other than said salary and expenses. Employees of the Legislature shall receive no compensation other than their salary or per diem."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,
Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article XVI, section 2, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:
"Sec. 2. When three-fifths of the members elected to the Legislature deem it necessary to call a convention to revise, amend, or change this constitution, they shall recommend to the electors to vote at the next election of members of the Legislature, for or against a convention, and if a majority of the electors voting on the proposition, vote for a convention, the Legislature shall, at its next session provide by law for calling the same; Provided, the votes cast in favor of calling a convention shall not be less than thirty-five per cent of the total votes cast at such election. The convention shall consist of not more than one hundred members, the exact number to be determined by the Legislature, and to be nominated and elected from districts in the manner to be prescribed by the Legislature. Such members shall meet within three months after their election, for the purpose aforesaid. No amendment or change of this constitution, agreed upon by such convention, shall take effect until the same has been submitted to the electors of the state, and adopted by a majority of those voting for or against the same."

TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,
Section 1. That at the general election in November, 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article XVI, section 1, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:
"Sec. 1. The Legislature may propose amendments to this Constitution. If the same be agreed to by three-fifths of the members elected to the Legislature, such proposed amendments shall be entered on the Journal, with the yeas and nays, and published once each week for three consecutive weeks, in at least one newspaper in each county, where a newspaper is published, immediately preceding the next election of members of the Legislature. At such election said amendments shall be submitted to the electors for approval or rejection upon a ballot separate from that upon which the names of candidates appear. If a majority of the electors voting on any such amendment adopt the same, it shall become a part of this Constitution, provided the votes cast in favor of such amendment shall not be less than thirty-five per cent of the total votes cast at such election. When two or more amendments are submitted at the same election, they shall be so submitted as to enable the electors to vote on each amendment separately."
