TEXT OF PROPOSED CONSTITU-TIONAL AMENDMENT Be it enacted by the people of the State

Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,
Section I. That at the general election in November 1952, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval the following amendment to Article III, section 19, of the Constitution of Nebraska, which is hereby proposed by the Legislature:
"Sec. 19. The Legislature shall never grant any extra compensation to any public officer, agent, or servant after the services have been rendered nor to any contractor after the contract has been entered into, nor shall the compensation of any public officer, including any officer whose compensation is fixed by the Legislature, be increased or diminished during his term of office except that, when there are officers elected or appointed to a court, board, or commission having more than one member and the terms of one or more members commence and end at different times, the compensation of all members of such court, board, or commission may be increased or diminished at the beginning of the full term of any member thereof."

(4) To amend Article VII, section 13, to read as follows:

"Sec. 13. The general government of the state normal schools as now existing, and such other normal schools as may be established by law, shall be vested, under the direction of the Legislature, in a board of seven members to be styled Board of Education of State Normal Schools, six of whom shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislature, two each for a term of two, four, and six years, and two each biennium thereafter for a term of six years, and the Commissioner of Education shall be a member ex officio. The duties and powers of the board shall be prescribed by law, and the members thereof shall receive no compensation for the performance of their duties, but may be reimbursed their actual expenses incurred therein."
