

D. C. Opens 1st Mixed Playsite

WASHINGTON — Segregation moved one step nearer its end in the nation's capital last Thursday when the Board of Recreation voted 5-2 to integrate the highly controversial Rosedale playground.

This playground, hitherto "for white only," has been a storm center for more than a year, and citizens in its area had led a sustained fight against segregation which was joined by more than sixty civic and welfare groups.

The NAACP said that the Rosedale integration order would not, however, halt the suit against segregation in recreation facilities in the city which was filed in August, 1951.

Rosedale was expected to reopen Monday under its new "all races" policy, but D. C. Commissioners were pondering a delay Sunday.
