

> > Question: We have a hot water heating system, two radiators of which never give off much heat. Is there anything we can do to corect this trouble?

> > E.B.O., Brecksville, O. Answer: Hot water radiators that fail to heat are usually airbound. If you have a valve at the upper corner, remove it, or open the valve with a key, to let the air escape. You might try replacing the valve with a selfventing type which eliminates this trouble permanently.
