Solution

In the first place, the signature on the typewritten note was scrawled in pencil, but the dead man clutches a pen in his right hand. Secondly, why is he still holding a pen when his last living acts supposedly was with a gun. Thirdly, a would-be suicide doesn't usually shoot himself in the chest, which is uncertain, but usually in the temple. And fourth, there were no fingerprints on the gun, leading you to believe that the murderer was overly-cautious.
