a distinction now held by the King of Portugal. Peeresses are trying to outvie each other in the brilliancy of their tiaras. Lady Kilmorey, one of the most beautiful women in London, the wife of the Earl of Kilmorey, who was a boyhood intimate friend of the king; Lady Londonderry, the Duchess of Devonshire, and the Duchess of Portland are all said to be spending vast sums in order to celebrate the coronation by a display of jewels worthy of the occasion. It is reported that King Edward at the coronation will confer the semi-royal title of Duke of Inverness on the Duke of Fife, son-in-law of his Majesty.

A St. Paul, Minn., dispatch to the Chicago Tribune says: War has been declared in the northwestern states against the promoters of the Burlington-Northwestern Pacific-Great Northern combine. Sentiment has developed in this state that foreshadows a state political issue if the subject is not summarily disposed of. The demand upon Governor Van Sant for a special session of the legislature is so strong that he probably will issue the call this week. A spontaneous demand has sprung up in Minnesota during the last few days for the convening of the legislature for the purpose of enacting legislation that will prevent any change in the management or direction of these roads. This feeling has been aggravated by an opinion of the attorney general and of the state railroad and warehouse commission that the state has no jurisdiction over the traffic of the iron ore roads of the northern part of this state, owned by the United States Steel company, practically shutting out the independent mine owner from mining or shipping his ore at a profit. The newspapers are unanimous in the opinion that something must be done at once or the railroads will override all the laws of the state. The opposition charges that the combination organized to control the Great Northern and Northern Pacific is formed for the purpose of circumventing the law in this and other states, and the suggestion is made that laws be enacted that corporations legalized in New Jersey will have no legal recognition here unless they shall be chartered by the state of Minnesota as if they held no other charter. In North Dakota a similar feeling prevails and Governor White has the subject of a special session under consideration along the lines proposed in Minnesota.

Secretary Root on Execution of Czolgosz.

Secretary Root has written the following letter to Governor Odell, of New York, commending the manner in which the trial and execution of Czolgosz were conducted:

The court, the prosecuting attorney, the officers who had the prisoner in charge, all appear to have performed their duties with effectiveness and decorum, and particular credit seems due to the distinguished gentlemen who, upon the request of the bar of Erie county, undertook the disagreeable task of protecting the legal rights of the wretched culprit under the assignment of the court.

The course of justice was swift, but measured. Protection against lawless violence was shown to be consistent with the certain and awful punishment of guilt. No opportunities for

defense were withheld; but no opportunity for spectacular play, or the gratification of vanity, which is so great an incentive to such crimes, was afforded. I know that this has been appreciated by the cabinet of the late President McKinley, and it is especially appreciated by the representative of New York in that cabinet. I am authorized to say that President Roosevelt fully concurs in the sentiments I have expressed.

The Prize Money.

The Washington Times is authorized by the statement that Admiral Sampson, who did not participate in the battle of Santiago Bay, is the only commander, not excepting Dewey, who has received more than ten thousand dollars as prize money. Admiral Schley, who commanded in that great battle and on whom the popular verdict has bestowed the title of hero of Santiago Bay, has received the magnificent sum of \$18.12 in prize money.

The total amount of bounty money which has been distributed in accordance with appropriation acts is \$449,574. Of this sum \$181,350 was awarded to participants in the Manila engagement, exclusive of Admiral Dewey, whose apportionment was granted in a special act of congress. To the heroes of Santiago \$158,365 was allotted, and congress allowed Rear Admiral Sampson \$8,335. For the destruction of the Spanish vessels at Manzanillo on June 30 bounty money amounting to \$21,400 was apportioned.


In this case, as well as in the second battle on July 18, for which \$29,500 bounty money was allowed, it was held that the Spanish fleets were inferior to those of the United States, and therefore \$100 per capita in the enemy's fleet should be granted as the

legal award. The crews engaged in the fight at Nipe Bay received \$15,700. Admiral Sampson received one-twentieth of these last three items, which was the fractional amount of bounty allowed him as commander.

Provided a higher tribunal sustains the decision of Justice Bradley in a United States district court that the Don Juan de Austria, the Isla de Cuba, and Isla de Luzon, the Reina Mercedes and the Maria Teresa are legitimately prize, which the government contests on the grounds that the expense of raising and repairing them greatly reduced their value, it will be barely possible for Admiral Schley to get about \$1,000 prize money, in addition to the \$18.12 already received.
