Railway destroyed Eight thousand naen are camped outside and are marshalling to attack the city. The revolution is serious."

It is feared that serious trouble may ensue between the citizens of Parkersburg, W. Va., and the Baltithe arbitrary measures adopted by the railroad. On March 17 the railway brought a force of men into the town before daylight and began to lay a track for five blocks over one of the principal streets of the city. This so incensed the citizens that the fre department was called out and poured a stream of water on the workmen requiring them to desist. The mayor of the city, who sides with the rail road officials, has been impeached on this account by the city council.

The recent devastations by the high water have not been confined to one section of the country, but seem to aflect a very large portion. Dispatches of the inundations, Wyo., give news as the Red Desert. Large guantities of supplies and other property been washed away and a constant watch is being kept on the embankment along the Union Pacific road.

According to a dispstch from San Francisco, Cal., returned missionaries from China give confirmation of the recent rumors regarding the renewed activity of the Boxers. It seems that the movement in sonthern China is directed against the dynasty, while in the northern part it is against the flocking into the cities, the country being no longer safe for foreigners.

In a speech made by Colonial Secretary Chamberlain in the English house of commons on March 19 he stated that 100,000 Boers had been repatriated and the government had given $\$ 75,000,000$ toward the expenses of their resettlement.

It was reported recently that the house and senate of Missouri adopted a resolution submitting an amendment to the constitution, requiring all Missourl railroads to grant free transportation over their lines in Missouri o state officials and legislators dur ing their official terms.

March 20, the anniversary of the death of Louis Kossuth, was marked in Buda Pesth by unusual student demonstrations and collisions with the police of the city. After a number of arrests had been made, the students dispersed.

A serious break in the Mississippi evee near Memphis, Tenn., on March $2 v$ calused the ruin of many fine plantations along the course of the river. Many familles were made homeless and destitute and flocked into Memphis for shelter and food.
