Harvey; Des Moines; judge of the supreme court, J. A. Lowenberg, Ottumwa; railroad commissioner, Walter McCullah, Davis City; superintendent of public instruction, Hilo Bruce, Stuart.

Recently Czar Nicholas of Russia issued an imperial ukase, placing the Amur district and the Kwang Tung province under General Alexieff, who is to assume the title of imperial lieutenant of these territories. In this decree the czar explains the reason for taking this step in the government of the provinces and expresses the hope that a peaceful development of Russia and her provinces may take place.

It appears that strong measures are eing taken by Turkey to suppress the insurgent outbreak in Macedonia. Great numbers of Turkish troops are being hurried to Adrianople and othr centers of the disturbance, but the Macedonlans are into that country from Bulgaria for the purpose of asfrom Bulgari
