From Lynn, Mass., September 25, it was announced that "because of over-production" the General Electric company has reduced its working force by about 5,000 men.

An Associated press cablegram under date of Manila, September 24, says: Dominador Gomez, a former Spanish officer, awaiting sentence upon the charge of maintaining an illegal organization known as the Union Obrero, was today charged with rebellion and insurrection for inciting ladrones
