street car employes in Chicago is being further complicated by the sympathy the teamsters of the city show to their cause. On November 19 all the teamsters in the employ of the Chicago City Railway company, to the number of sixty, quit work, and it is the intention to prevent the delivery of coal and supplies to the railway company until the strike is settled.

The American Federation of Labor on November 19 passed on the "open shop" issue, as raised in the case of William A. Miller, now employed in the government printing office at Washington, by declaring unanimously in favor of the union shop in government as well as private enterprises and a petition is to be sent to President Roosevelt to re-examine the evidence offered in the Miller case. On to remove Miller from the case were also the same day resolved. The construction of the canal by citizens of the States; urging that the Chinese

exclusion act be made to apply to the Philippine and Hawaiian islands, and favoring woman suffrage and the election of the president and United States senators by direct vote.

According to advices from London sources, the Japanese are actively preparing for war, and the Chinese government has withdrawn its note to the provincial governments, advising them to prepare for war. The attitude of the Russian authorities in Manchuria and Corea continues to be such as to greatly aggravate the Japanese there and it is feared that war cannot much longer be averted.

The second trial of D. V. Miller and Joseph M. Johns, both of Indiana, and under indictment on the charge of conspiracy to extort bribes from the postoffice department, was held recently at Cincinnati, O., and resulted in an acquittal. This marks the close of the first of the postal fraud cases to be heard.

On November 20 Mr. Joseph Chamberlain addressed a great audience at Cardiff, Wales, his subject being the tariff question. He was greeted by an enthusiastic audience and at the close of his address resolutions were adopted promising hearty support to Mr. Chamberlain's fiscal policy.

It was again announced that the strike among the coal miners in the northern part of Colorado is practically settled, although no official confirmation of the report was given out up to November 20. It is said, however, that the miners are being urged by John F. Ream, the representative of the national organization, to settle their differences.

Little by little the labor troubles in the eastern sections seem to adjust themselves. It was announced from Pittsburg, Pa., on November 20, that not less than 6,000 men who have been idle a month or two will return to work very shortly.

Gen. F. M. Drake, ex-governor of Iowa, died at Centerville, Ia., on November 20, after an illness of several days' duration. General Drake was born on December 30, 1830, and served as governor of the state of Iowa from 1896 to 1898. He was noted for his liberal endowment of Drake university at Des Moines, and he served through the civil war, being brevetted brigadier general of volunteers.

Recent reports from the scene of hostilities in San Domingo indicate that the trouble in that quarter is by no means yet over. There have been several conflicts between the government troops and the rebels and so far it is not known which side has the advantage. The United States cruiser has landed American marines to protect the American interests and the American legation and consulate are being guarded.


