On Sunday, May 28 , the rst news the Russian fleet under he Russian fleet under Admiral Rojestvensky and the Jai nese fleet under Admiral Tcgo. The first news
came from the Amerizan consul at Tokio and indicated a sweeping vic tory for Japan. The dispatches Mon day more than confirmed the firs reports. The Japanese, in a running fight lasting several days, destroyed and captured nineteen Russian war vesseis, and took an immense number of prisoners. The Tuesday morning dispatches said that Admiral Rojestvensky's flag ship had been sunk, and that the admiral w n g killed. The Japanese maintain their strict cen sorship and reports concerning the losses sustained by Togo are very meagre. There is a seemingly well authenticated report, however, that the Japanese sustained only a trifi ing loss. The battle was one of the greatest, if not the greatest, ever fought on the sea. Paris dispatches indicate that French feeling is de cidedly in favor of Russia seeking peace in the most favorable terms possible.
