

1908 by 741. He adds that Delaware county, joining Madison on the east, gave Mr. Roosevelt 4900 in 1904 while Mr. Taft carried it by 1788, a change of more than 2000 votes in Mr. Bryan's favor.

F. L. Wacholz of Forest City, Ia., writes: "We made a fine showing in this county and increased our vote 174 per cent over the vote four years ago. Mr. Parker polled 174 in this county in 1904, and Mr. Bryan polled 477 in November, 1908. We think we are entitled to the mule for showing this large percentage of increase. This county at one time had the Tippecanoe banner for the strongest republican county Iowa."

J. S. Gormley of Shawnee, Ohio, writes that Perry county, Ohio, gave Mr. Roosevelt in 1904, 2300 majority; this year Mr. Taft carried it by 419-a gain of 1882.
